New laboratory equipment set off from Belgium in December and has arrived in Uganda and Ghana, where it will be transported to reference laboratories and surveillance sites. Establishing laboratory capacity is one of the Fleming Fund's core activities and we are excited to welcome the arrival of these initial shipments. Next month, our equipment suppliers will train laboratory staff and grantees to use the new machines which we believe will better equip countries to collect and use AMR data.

Seven beneficiaries from Nigeria, South Africa and Tanzania attended an advanced bio-informatics training in Denmark this month to learn about bio-informatics tools and Whole Genome Sequencing (WGS) data analysis. The training was aimed at preparing participants for the large volume of WGS data that will be generated in the coming months. Trainees were positive about the outcomes and are looking forward to applying this information back at home. Many of them are on track to become experts in bio-informatics within their home countries and across the continent.
